### **ON PHOTOS**

Lately I've been getting a bit of commentary on photos in the <u>Flash</u>. The gist of them is that 2016 photos seem to have deteriorated from those presented in 2015 and before. I appreciate these thoughts because every criticism presents an opportunity for our improvement.

Why 2016? Well, it is apparent we are getting smaller photo files, more likely taken with cell-phones than with digital cameras. The better cellphones, however, can take terrific photos if thought is given to lighting. (Lighting from the front is ALWAYS better than lighting behind the subjects.) In fact, many of these

cellphone photos are as good as, if not better than, many of the dedicated camera photos.

When in doubt, however, submit your photos. Sometimes I can take one photo from a group of three and it will work fine; given only one, especially of an important event, I'll just have to make do. But even then, any photo's better than none...

I can often take a mediocre photo and improve it. **In fact, almost every photo printed in the <u>Flash</u> has been manipulated. Typically I must enhance photos as to exposure and brightness, and sometimes in other ways, to get them passable.** 

If you yourself are taking the photos: focus is the most difficult parameter for us to correct. If your subject is in focus a better result is likely. Don't "rush" a photo--give your camera or cellphone adequate time to sense the proper focus if it has auto-focus (almost all do).

A special focus problem is often presented in taking photos of breaking. I have many times received compliments on those photos which seem to show the technique at full extension, the boards or tiles flying through the air. There is a special focus trick that I have had success with: focus on the side of the boards closest to you with a downward push of the shutter button and continue to hold it half-way down. With many modern cameras, autofocus will stay "constant" if that button is held depressed before actually taking the photo. In short, focus on the board, not the student (who will be in motion and thus difficult to focus on at the key moment).

With the focus thus held, you may **then** point the camera at the student's likely final position to frame the picture appropriately just before the actual shot. (We have a lot of pictures of people without heads, left arms, etc.) If you have a sophisticated adjustable camera, consider a high ISO such as 800 or 1600.

Another fundamental of good photos: better to see the front of the student than the back.

How many photos shall I submit? I'd say, give us a choice of five or six of your better ones, the ones that show off your event and your students. Pictures that tell a story are great. "Action photos" are great. A disk of 200 photos would likely tie up a half-day just to get down to manageable choices.

These are just some things to keep in mind, and I hope they are helpful and we can continue to improve The Flash on our end.
