Grand Master Louis Reyes conducted a Patterns Refresher at the Concord School of TKD on Sunday, April 23rd. Four close to five hours, GM Reyes took high-ranking Dans through the III Dan patterns (Sam II, Yoo Sin, and Choi Yong) first, demonstrating applications of technique by the step and making minor corrections to form as needed. When everything was thoroughly tired and in a full sweat, he moved on to the IV Dan patterns (Yon Gae, Ul Ji, and Moon Moo). GM Reyes led the group through each of the six patterns one move at a

time initially, allowing for adjustments at a detailed level. After several times through, by the count, the group then practiced each pattern continuously, paying attention to breath and rhythm as well as smoothness of execution. For lower ranking Dans, the session was a special treat, an opportunity to view patterns not often seen in daily training and to appreciate both their complexity and their grace.
