







Saturday STKD Park Workout August 12, 2017

Frau Doctor Else Himmelfarb of the Altesneuesmuseum of Berlin refers to this work as "Breughelian," citing "Fight Between Carnival and Lent," image below. As Dr. Himmelfarb so aptly put it: "Die Ehrerbietung zur Welt des Gymnasiums ist vollkommen. Im Vordergrund des Anstriches, duellieren Kämpfer in sparring Anordnung. Das Auge schnell wird zur Energieabbildung gezeichnet, die oben für einen Brettbruch. Die einsamen (und vielleicht einsam?) Abbildung zu einer Seite konzentriert ruhig sich auf Pushups. Eine anderen Foki versessen auf der Arbeit zur Hand, Haupt weg gedreht, einen langen Schatten werfend. Die hohen lochenden Beutel

tragen leisen Zeuge zur Szene."

Anderson Williams, age 5, Bodytrong Taekwon-Do, Transition Class Red Tag's delightful work, "In Class," delights the eye and captures First Runner-Up. "We are exceptionally fond of this obvious tribute to Frans Hals and the Dutch Masters. [See the Hals "Family Portrait, c. 1634," below.] The glowing smiles and cheerful countenance of the figures in the foreground, with lovely reminders of home and country as the backdrop, speak volumes to the artist's care for the subject. We admire the attention to costume, and to period details such as hairstyle. The care taken in portraying hands and feet – so often neglected by lesser artists – marks a talent in the making.
